Dear Dog Park Committee Members and Co. Parks Dept.

I think I need to be clear about why I keep repeating, please, do NOT allow off leash dogs on the tot lot side of Quarry Park including the 2 +/- acres of scenic play fields above the tot lot because it is the logical extension for families or groups to play sports on or picnic, etc.

Also, I see the same people with their dogs almost daily who have taken over that area above the tot lot to use as their own personal dog park. Some of them are elderly or semi-handicapped who cannot climb the trails nor the short distance to the Quarry Floor or who have a limited time and prefer a flat area to play ball and let their dogs run around freely, so they need a flat area, a designated dog park.

I have spoken to many in the Community who agree with this, including the dog owners. We support a real dog park on the other side of the parking lot for those who would rather throw a ball and have their dogs go fetch. We also support designated QP trails and perhaps the quarry floor for off leash.

Some of these people come almost daily to sit at the table above the tot lot and throw the ball for their dogs to fetch. So, along with the dog park, a couple of tables and/or benches would also be good to place at one end of the dog park.

While planning for our four legged family members, I think we have forgotten the human children who also need to play and run and have fun, including older teens or sports groups. That area is the only play field left in El Granada for our kids and groups to play ball on, or frisbee, or other activities including just getting together or having a picnic, etc. The dogs are intimidating, and I have witnessed people and children shy away when the dogs are running around in that area.

The County now owns about 800 acres of trails and parkland and I don't think it's asking too much to keep those 3 or 4 acres of park including the tot lot for just families and children and groups to picnic or play sports without having dogs running around and doing everything that dogs do.

The same thing goes for the Pillar Point Bluffs. I support off leash on the trails but wonder if a portion of the bluffs couldn't be fenced in for people to play fetch with their dogs rather than having all of them running around on the trails?

Also, if for some reason a dog park can't be created in either area, then I'm wondering why couldn't a section of East Mirada Surf be part of a dog park? There is certainly a need for more than one or two enclosed dog parks on the Coast and probably even more on the peninsula side of the bay.

Dear County Parks Dog Work Group,

I am writing for the fourth time (in what is beginning to feel a futile attempt) to voice my concerns and help you understand where public sentiment lies in your county.

Specifically, this comment addresses two issues;

1. County Parks' off leash dog-walking site selection
2. County Parks' recent spray of the known carcinogenic Roundup at the Pillar Point Bluffs

Off leash dog site selection:

On October 7, the Dog Work Group was supposed to move to a majority vote on the Pillar Point Bluffs (rather than unanimous consensus), but your facilitator didn't do it.

She is showing clear bias, and it's becoming quite obvious that County Parks is dragging out this process to try to wear us down. *That will not work.* **There is overwhelming community support for off-leash access at the Bluffs.**

We are asking you to do two things and turn your community citizens into allies instead of foes:

- 1. Move at the Nov 4 meeting to a majority vote for off-leash walking, and**
- 2. Vote for off-leash on all trials at the Bluffs at that same meeting.**

Let's end the combative process and enlist the dog walkers in helping you maintain these beautiful lands.

On Roundup Spray:

I was absolutely stunned to arrive for my daily dose of fresh air, nature and recreational healing — on a day the coast was already crippled by a power outage by PG&E — to see you had chosen that day (with VERY high winds) to spray a KNOWN cancer-causing agent.

These are lands where humans and dogs in your county go for fresh air and healthy exercise!

Roundup (and its main component, glyphosate) has been proven cancerous to not just dogs but also humans, and there have been several lawsuits where Bayer/Monsanto have been fined billions of dollars in damages.

I don't know why you are still using that poison, unless it was a deliberate effort to punish and poison dog walkers. I view it that way, especially because you chose to spray it on THE DAY we were in the middle of a crippling power/internet/mobile phone outage on the coast. It was a clear slap in the face, or an effort to get us to go away and stop commenting to you.

These kinds of acts will NOT work in your favor. They will only create a group of militant citizens who will work against you at every turn. Do you want to incite riots?

I encourage you to look into the harmful effects of Roundup and STOP spraying it in our state's parks.

Thank you. Once again, I implore you: let's end the combative process and enlist the dog walkers in helping you maintain these beautiful lands.

Subject: Off leash dog walking at Pillar Point Bluff

My name is [REDACTED], I am a 21 year resident of Moss Beach and have walked the blufftop at Pillar Point with my dog for the past 2 1/2 years

Pillar Point Bluff has long been, and needs to remain, available to walk dogs off leash.

There are many benefits to dogs to have off leash time. They can run, play with other dogs and chase balls. Allowing them this limited freedom is good for their health and their mental well being and allows their humans to walk free of entanglement or the need to stop every five feet so their dog can sniff or pee.

I have been to many dog work group meetings and have yet to hear a non hypothetical reason why dogs should not be allowed to continue off leash in this area.

I have heard no evidence that dogs are doing environmental damage to the bluff top.

I have heard no evidence that suggests conflicts with non dog or on leash dog walkers are anything other than a rare occurrence.

I have heard no evidence that off leash dogs are running down to the beach from the bluff top to endanger the seals or other marine life.

The risk to seals is from people who are unwilling to follow the rules, obey the signs and insist on taking their dogs to the beach. This will not change if dog leash use is enforced on the bluff top.

Those of us that walk with our dogs there are careful to pick up trash and poop, whether or not it is from our own dogs. Our off leash dogs are kept under voice control and leashed if that is not possible or when encountering others like cyclists and joggers.

And we are also more than willing to help patrol the beach to aid in the detection and prevention of risks to seals from those who are not willing to follow the rules.

Certainly more intensive patrolling of the beach is a better use of ranger time than handing out tickets for the non criminal act of walking a dog off leash

I wish San Mateo County residents who actually use and pay for these parks were able to have more input into these decisions. I would hope that meetings could be held at times and places more conducive to public input; particularly the working public.

But as they are not I hope you will consider the petition that was circulated among dog walkers on the coast. It was done in a very short time frame but does indicate overwhelming support for off leash dog walking.

PETITION IN SUPPORT OF VOICE CONTROL DOG WALKING ON THE PILLAR POINT BLUFFTOP

TO: SAN MATEO COUNTY PARKS & THE DOG WORK GROUP

For decades, the Pillar Point Blufftop has been a valuable community resource, serving as a popular voice control dog walking area on the coast. Our community of dog lovers has been the primary steward of this land, including working with POST to protect it from development, keeping the Bluffs clean by always picking up after our dogs, and picking up after others who leave trash behind.

In April 2018, a tragic and extremely rare incident occurred when an off-leash dog killed a seal at Ross Cove beach in the Fitzgerald Marine Reserve. While heartbreaking, the incident had nothing to do with people walking their dogs under voice control up on the Pillar Point Blufftop. The Marine Reserve beaches are largely inaccessible from the Bluffs due to an 80-foot cliff.

As animal lovers, we all want to protect the Marine Reserve beaches. However, banning the long-time practice of voice control dog walking way up on the Blufftop does not accomplish this goal. It only results in alienating a large segment of the community and in pulling ranger resources away from the Marine Reserve beaches where they are needed most.

The best way to protect the Marine Reserve beaches is to work with our community and allow the already institutionalized practice of voice control dog walking to continue up on the Blufftop, while having a zero-tolerance policy for people who bring their dogs down to the Marine Reserve's no-dog beaches. As a community, we believe that irresponsible dog owners who ignore the no-dog rule on Fitzgerald Marine Reserve beaches should be heavily fined and the fine amount should be posted on all County Park signs to the beaches. Our community can help lighten County Parks ranger workload by helping to educate dog owners about the no dogs on the beaches rule, and reporting any dogs we see down at the Reserve.

We hope to work with County Parks in order to make the Pillar Point Bluffs off-leash pilot a great success, while providing greater protection for the Marine Reserve beaches. The

Bluffs—with its wide trails, long history of voice control dog walking, and physical separation from the Marine Reserve beaches—is the perfect place for sanctioned voice control dog walking.
